



1. Enter classroom.google.com into your search bar





2. "Select Classroom" OR "Sign In"




3. If you come to this page, select: “Go to classroom”
OR select:
“Sign in” then, select “Google Classroom”




4. Enter your student’s school assigned e-mail.
This is: first initial, last name,@glacierviewschool.com
For example: mevans@glacierviewschool.com
Hit “Next” button.



5. Enter your student's school assigned password. Hit "Next" button.



6. Here, your student will be able to view all their classes. They should click on the "waffle symbol" and then on the calendar icon. Here they will see their schedule & can join the 9:00am Google Hangout Meet.



Questions and Answers:

What does my student need for online school?

1. Supervised access to a computer with a camera, mic, and internet.
2. Support & encouragement.
3. A school space to do work.
4. Weekly supplies from locker.
5. Basic school supplies. (Pencils, crayons/markers, scissors, glue).
6. K-3: Headphones with a mic (may check-out from GVS).

Will my student be able to send e-mail messages?

No. We have assigned students with school e-mail addresses so that they can log into Google Classroom, BUT we have disabled their ability to send and receive e-mails. This has been done with their interest and safety in mind.

Does my student have to log-in every day?

Yes, if they want to receive attendance credit. We ask students to be signed in and ready by 9:00am when our video conference is set to begin. To avoid stress, resist the temptation to start this process at 9:00am. Students will need a few minutes to get on and ready. Late joiners interrupt the video conference.

Does my child have to be in front of a computer screen all day?

No. Students are expected to be present online during the class video conferences each morning and arranged video conferences with teachers. They will access their assignments online via Google Classroom. Sometimes videos, instructions and quizzes will be online. However, many worksheets can be printed off. Book work, experiments, and hands-on projects will also be included in your student's day.

What if my student can't log in?

Check that they've entered the e-mail address and password correctly. There are no capitol letters and no spaces. Make certain you have not accidentally pushed caps lock or # lock on your keyboard. If you still cannot log in, **please call or text your student's teacher**. We will help talk you through the process.

I'm not a teacher. How am I supposed to teach my kids all this stuff?

Reach out to us. It is not a bother for you, or your student, to call and text us with questions. **This is OUR JOB!** We expect lots of questions during the learning process. If they already know how to do easily- they are ready for some new challenges. We accept calls during our working hours and will get to messages, received after hours, the next working day.

How long are we doing this?

We wish we knew. We will keep you updated during this process. The REMIND app will continue to be our main source for making announcements and updates.

How does my student turn in work and how does it get graded?

A lot of work will be submitted online via Google Classroom. Some assignments, such as Art projects, will be turned in via a texted pic. Other assignments that do not fit this category can be turned in weekly to your family's assigned school locker.

How do I get payments to the school?
